**Professional Training
Grant continued**

In a recent communication received from Dr. J. Crawford — Deputy Minister of National Health, we are informed that the professional training grant in the amount of \$15,000 made available to the College in recent years, to assist in the promotion of selected College activities, will be continued for the fiscal year 1969/70. Specifically, this assistance is provided: to promote research into community needs for health services; to assist in the preparation of undergraduate training programs in family practice; to further develop advanced or graduate training for family practice, and to assist in the preparation of criteria for approval of facilities to be used in training programs for family practice.
