Working group updates

Besrour Papers and Research: The group continues to develop and finalize various manuscripts from its Canada-Brazil journal series. The group also continues to explore opportunities to grow capacity within the Besrour Research working group.

Scientific Committee: The committee thanks you for your feedback on last year's poster sessions. Your comments have been instrumental in shaping the 2018 poster sessions and guidelines. A call for posters has been launched with the deadline date of July 3, 2018.

Faculty Development: A recent survey completed by Besrour partners has identified competency-based training, particularly the Triple C Competency-based curriculum and CanMEDS-FM competencies, as key areas of interest for Besrour partners in the global South. As a result of this feedback, the group has begun developing a template workshop and resource kit to enable family medicine faculty in LMICs to develop a competency-based family medicine training program. The group is currently in the planning stages of this project, and hope to feature it at the 2018 Besrour Forum.

Continuing Medical Education: The group continues to explore a concrete initiative on which to focus in 2018, including ways to align its work with other medical education and training-focused Besrour groups.

Narratives and FM Mapping: The Storybooth team, led by Drs. Vincent Cubaka (primary author), Christine Gibson, Clayton Dyck, Russell Dawe, Baraa Alghalyini, Molly Whalen-Browne, and Gabriel Cejas have completed the manuscript for the Storybooth, which was submitted to the *Annals of Family Medicine* last month. Dr. Bob Woollard is working on the second paper in the Institutional Narratives series for *Canadian Family Physician*. The group is also looking at how to write an article tying narratives to research for *The Lancet's* primary care research call for papers. The Storybooth project has been accepted for the WONCA World Conference in Seoul, South Korea, in October 2018.

Resident Group: The group continues to work with the CFPC Indigenous Health working group to develop their literature search on the effects of reconciliation and health care globally, using the PICO method.
