The Section of Communities of Practice in Family Medicine (CPFM) provides a professional home for college members that offers support for their lifelong learning and professional needs. This section is composed of communities of practice committees in **19 different domains** of family medicine. CPM section and committee initiatives benefit the range of work that family physicians do, from those who provide comprehensive, continuing care to their patients, to those practices focused on specific medical domains.

Advisory Group

If you are interested in further participation on the program committee(s), the CPM CPM programs have established advisory groups. These committees would like your help in representing you, our members. By becoming a part of a group that advises and supports these program committees, your opinion will help guide us as we create policies, provide practice support, and work on your behalf.

We are developing a list of interested individuals from each CPM to call on, through a listserv or other dedicated platform, when the committee needs help. These advisory groups may be used to seek your opinion on a policy statement, to work on short projects, to sit on a working group, or to help with CPD, to suggest just a few examples. Opportunities to participate will vary based on committee need.

Your participation in the CPM program committee advisory group is voluntary. If you decide to participate in an advisory group you may opt to participate in a particular activity when asked or you may choose not to. The expected time commitment will be communicated for each activity when calling for participants; however, the groups themselves will not involve any required time from participants. We intend to update the panel on a biannual basis but you may choose to withdraw at any time. Members of the advisory group will not be financially compensated in any way.
