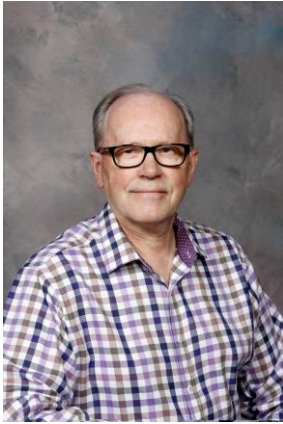


**John Maxted, MD, MBA, CCFP, FCFP**  
**Director-at-Large**

A medical graduate of the University of Ottawa, **Dr John Maxted** earned his Certification in Family Medicine from The College of Family Physicians of Canada (CFPC) in 1976, and became a Fellow in 2004. In 1995, Dr Maxted received a Masters degree in Business Administration from the University of Toronto (U of T).

With a medical career that spans 40 years, Dr Maxted currently practices comprehensive family medicine and is involved in teaching and administration at the Health for All Family Health Team/Markham Family Medicine Teaching Unit which he helped to found at Markham- Stouffville Hospital, Ontario. In this role, he serves as Lead Physician for the Family Health Organization (Core Faculty), advocating on behalf of physicians' interests.

Dr Maxted is Assistant Professor with the Department of Family and Community Medicine (DFCM) at U of T. In addition to teaching, he is a lead for advancing patient safety in primary care at the DFCM with recognized expertise in patient safety across Canada.

Dr Maxted has served in many leadership roles throughout his career. From 2002 to 2010, he was Director, and subsequently, Associate Executive Director of Health Policy and Public Policy at the CFPC, where he was a significant contributor to the development of several health policy papers focused on advancing family medicine in Canada. Dr Maxted also served as Vice President of Professional Affairs with Comcare Health Services in London, and as Chief of Medical Staff with Grand River Hospital in Kitchener, which led to a 6-month role as Acting Chief Executive Officer in 1998.

Dr Maxted has participated on several boards and committees throughout his career. Currently, he is Chair of the Health for All Family Health Team board, and a Board Director with Accreditation Canada. He is a former Board Director with the Canadian Public Health Association as well as a former Director with the Boards of the Chatham Public General Hospital, and subsequently the Kitchener-Waterloo Grand River Hospital where he served as Chief of Staff.

In 2012, Dr Maxted received the Award of Excellence from the CFPC and the Bright Lights Award from the Association of Family Health Teams of Ontario. He was the recipient of U of T's Innovation in Education Award in 2014, the Excellence in Teaching Award in 2015, and the QI Program Founder's Award in 2016.
