The first FM Pivot module has been launched! Following the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, the FM Pivot Educational Initiative was developed by a team of global Besrour Centre partners to help family physicians and family medicine educators prepare for similar challenges in the future within their own contexts. Research and Narratives

The Dr. Patrick Chege Memorial Research Award – The Scientific Committee has been reviewing more than 30 abstracts in preparation for the poster sessions taking place at FMF 2021.

FM Vax: An International Survey on the Integration of Public Health and Primary Care in COVID-19 Vaccination Campaigns – The Besrour Centre has been leading an international study with the Primary Health Care Research Consortium (PHCRC) about primary health care perspectives on the integration of primary care and public health during the COVID-19 vaccination rollout. Our aim is to understand the relationship between public health-primary care integration and implementation outcomes. The Besrour Centre will soon be disseminating this survey and we welcome your participation!

Besrour Fellowship 2020 – The group continues to support Dr. Trinidad Rodriguez on the development of the training program that enables multidisciplinary health teams to improve the strategy of care provided to infants, children, adolescents, and their families—a capacity-building initiative. This program is part of a multi-level intervention that is being developed by her team at the Health

Innovation Center at Universidad Católica in Santiago, Chile. The project aims to create a strategy of health care for children that emphasizes implementing the principles of family and community health and focuses on attachment theory and nurturing relationships with caregivers.

Besrour Partner Update



Associate Professor Klaus von Pressentin is a family physician and the head of the Division of Family Medicine in the School of Public Health and Family Medicine at the University of Cape Town, South Africa. Prior to joining the University of Cape Town in May 2020, he worked mainly in the rural areas of the public health system over the previous two decades. His scholarly interests include family medicine and primary care (including chronic diseases) as well as health services strengthening (especially leadership and clinical governance). These interests align well with the Besrour Centre's Global Co-RIG-funded project led by the University of Cape Town, "Innovations to reduce morbidity and mortality amongst people with diabetes in vulnerable communities, Cape Town, South Africa." The research team aims to complete the fieldwork by the end of August 2021, and hope that the findings from this evaluation will assist health care teams and planners enhance the provision of primary care to patients living with diabetes in the new era we find ourselves. Dr. Marcelo Garcia Dieguez is Associate Professor of Clinical and Epidemiological Analysis of Health Determinants Areas at the Universidad Nacional del Sur and Professor of Medical Education at the University Institute School of Medicine of the Italian Hospital in Argentina. Dr. Garcia Dieguez specializes in the field of medical education and currently serves as adviser for medical education and knowledge transfer for the Pan American Health Organization (PAHO) and WHO. He is also member of the editorial board of several journals in Spain and Latin America. Dr. Garcia Dieguez is a valued partner of the Besrour community, member of the Medical Education Advisory Group, providing guidance on a number of the Centre's initiatives including co-lead on the FM Pivot Medical Education Module.
