# **Besrour Working Group Updates**

#### **Medical Education and Training**

Drawing on the family physician experience with the COVID-19 pandemic, the group is developing the FM PIVOT Educational Resource. It aims to improve capacity and resilience of our global and

local health systems through capacity building of family physicians in responding and adapting to future global health emergencies. It will achieve this through a thematically based, competency focused, collaboratively developed platform of educational activities and resources, based on the WHO's PrimaryCare4People site.

#### **Advisory Group**

The Advisory Group met at the end of May to review and prioritize medical education activities and to identify champions for these activities.

The **Besrour Café** monthly discussions continue, with the last two focussing on COVID-19. Go <u>online</u> to listen to recordings of discussions. Café sessions are held last Tuesday of each month and we encourage our African colleagues to join us for future discussions. The group continues to work with the 2020 Besrour Fellow, Dr. Trinidad Rodriguez, on the Medical Education Research project.

# Global COVID-19 Pandemic Response and Impact Grant Program (Co-RIG Global)

Thanks to the generous support of the CFPC's Foundation for the Advancement of Family Medicine (FAFM) and the Fondation Docteur Sadok Besrour, the Besrour Centre is seeking two proposals valued up to C\$50,000 each for a global COVID-19 pandemic innovation response. The primary care response to COVID-19 must support innovation that targets and protects highly vulnerable populations who are faced with the lack of access to primary care.

This initiative aims to have the greatest impact for reducing morbidity and mortality associated with COVID-19. The family practice innovations that are likely to have a high degree of impact in reducing the harms of COVID-19 include education innovations, practice innovations, and responses that address equity and inclusion. The request for proposal will contribute to how innovative family practices will likely have a high degree of impact in reducing the harms associated with COVID-19.

### **Besrour COVID-19 Ad Hoc Committee**

This committee has come together to collaborate on COVID-19-specific projects, with the current focus on the Global COVID-19 Pandemic Response and Impact Grant Program (Co-RIG Global). The Committee oversees the Request for Proposal process.

# Live-Stream Webinar: The COVID-19 Pivot: Approaches to the global pandemic from an international perspective

Held on May 21st, this live-stream webinar gathered physicians from three different countries to discuss the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic in their area and on their clinical practices. Hosted by Dr. David Ponka, Director at the Besrour Centre for Global Family Medicine, it included guests Dr. William Goldberg (emergency physician, New York City, United States), Dr. Elena Klusova (family physician, Ibiza, Spain), and Dr. Nisanth Menon (family and emergency physician, Kochi, India). ### **Besrour Partner Profile**

Dr. Trinidad Rodriguez is a family physician from Santiago, Chile. She works in academic medicine at Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile and at a primary care centre with an underserved population. She is also working on a project at the Health Innovation Center at the Universidad Católica that proposes a strategy of health care for infants, children, and adolescents (ICA), which emphasizes implementing the principles of the family and community health model in primary care and focusses on attachment theory and nurturing relationships with caregivers. In that project Dr. Rodriguez is in charge of designing a program that enables multidisciplinary health teams to be part of a change in the strategy of care given to ICAs and their families—a capacity building initiative.
