





Foundation for Advancing Family Medicine (FAFM)

\$ 5 million

in funding was received from the Canadian Medical Association Foundation to launch the COVID-19 Pandemic Response and Impact Grant (Co-RIG) Program.

\$ 100,000

in funding was allocated to the Global Co-RIG Program, in collaboration with the Besroul Centre for Global Family Medicine, for projects in low- and middle-income countries.

\$ 100,000


was raised through the FAFM's new end-of-year Giving Campaign to support family medicine research, education, and service.

\$ 2 million

in funding went to 15 CFPC member-led initiatives in the first phase of the Co-RIG Program to support short-term innovations in response to the pandemic.

\$ 10,000


is the value of the new Racialized Communities Leadership Grant in Family Medicine.
