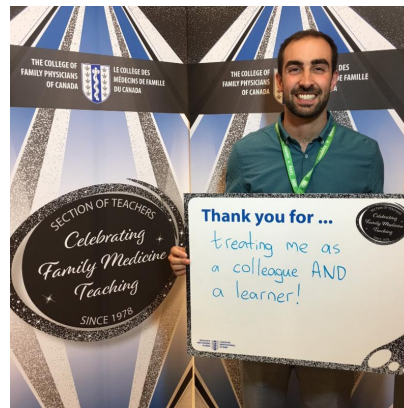

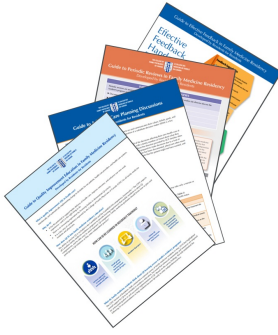
Help us develop exam materials
