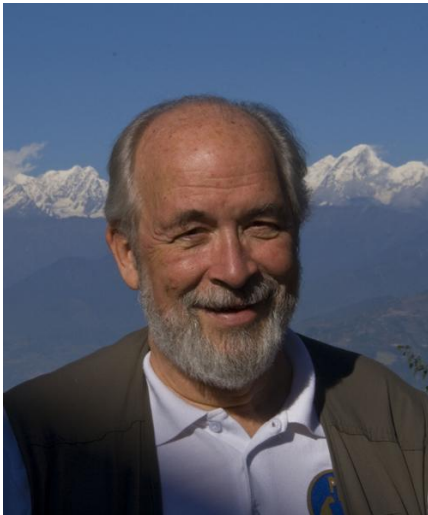

## Learn

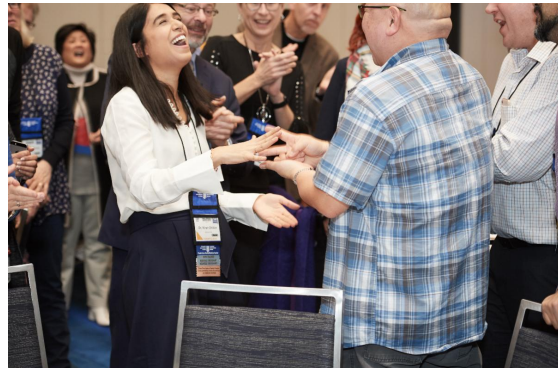
