Mainpro+[®] CPD Report 2022/23

We've analyzed Mainpro+ data from the past year to provide a snapshot of what Mainpro+ participants and continuing professional development (CPD) providers are doing across the country. This information highlights the commitment of Mainpro+ participants to ongoing learning, the adaptability of CPD providers, and the continued focus on practice assessment activities.

Mainpro+ participants must complete 250 credits in a five-year cycle, of which 125 must be certified credits. The annual cycle requirement is 25 credits, certified and/or non-certified.

The following data refer to the period of July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, (unless otherwise stated).

How members reached the Mainpro+ Team

During the reporting period our Mainpro+ coordinators supported members in a variety of ways, including answering telephone calls, answering questions live via the chat system, scheduling interactive screenshare sessions, and by coaching members on how to navigate and report CPD activities using Mainpro+. By the numbers, our Mainpro+ experts supported **1,114** members using Chat and scheduled **210** appointments.

SCFPC Learn

CFPCLearn is an on-demand education platform that features a wide range of Mainpro+ certified learning activities tailored for family physicians, including videos, podcasts, and the popular Tools for Practice.

During the reporting period, participants claimed credits for the following CPD activities:

24 Tools for Practice for a total of six credits
30 podcasts (0.5 credits each) for a total of 15 credits
3 e-courses for a total of 8.5 credits

The Member Interest Groups Section (MIGS) had **24** certified activities on CFPCLearn, worth a total of **22.5** credits.



The Self Learning Program allows physicians and primary care providers to evaluate their clinical knowledge and receive further information on topics in the medical literature. The content is drawn from peer-reviewed articles and curated by approximately 60 family physicians from across Canada.

Subscribers can earn up to 30 Mainpro+ certified credits per year. Residents, medical students, and international medical graduates are eligible for complimentary access to the Self Learning Program online as part of their CFPC membership.

A special edition was released in May 2023, and it featured top-rated questions from 2022.

Since 2022, subscribers can claim credits as far back as five years, as long as the credits are within their current Mainpro+ cycle.

Self Learning subscriptions and/or any previously published volumes (also known as a back issue) can be purchased via the <u>Self Learning website</u>. Sign in to your account, and click Manage subscription.

With our expanded Linking Learning program, Mainpro+ participants can earn certified credits by completing reflection on practice activities including Linking Learning to Practice, Teaching, Assessment, Research, and Administration. This is a great opportunity for members to earn Mainpro+ certified Assessment credits by reflecting on elements of their daily work.



Direct Credit Entry

The CFPC is excited to share that we've created a new direct credit entry (DCE) platform, which will make it easier for providers to offer direct credit entry to members. With DCE, participation in CPD activities is entered directly into the member's record.

As a member, your credits will be uploaded for you, which means no need to search for and manually enter those activities.

Professional Learning Plans

The Professional Learning Plan (PLP) is a free and bilingual Mainpro+ certified tool designed to help support family physicians in achieving their personalized CPD learning goals. The tool provides step-by-step guidance to address key needs, offers new opportunities for practice improvement, and helps members plan CPD goals at any stage in their professional practice. During this reporting period more than 1,500 new PLPs were started.

Our PLP Workshop, which was certified for up to 1.5 Group Learning credits, was created to provide members with an overview and demonstration of the PLP Tool. More than 100 members have registered for the workshop since its launch in early 2023. Mainpro+ Certification

More than 2,000 CPD activities were certified for Mainpro+ credits by the CFPC National Office, provincial Chapters, and university CPD offices accredited by the Committee on Accreditation of Continuing Medical Education (CACME).

There is a discernible trend indicating a recovery in the popularity of Live In-Person sessions. Although there was a decline in Live Webcast sessions and a modest reduction in Online Self-Study sessions, these modalities continue to maintain their popularity as a mode of learning for Mainpro+ participants. The current year reflects a nearly balanced distribution between in-person learning, making up 44 per cent of CPD, and virtual CPD activities making up the remaining amount.



Group Learning activities continue to be the most popular forms of CPD certified for Mainpro+ credits, whether in a virtual or in-person format.

The National Committee on Continuing Professional Development (NCCPD) is comprised of a dedicated group of 12 family physicians—with a chair, members representing each of the CFPC provincial Chapters, and one member in their first five years of practice. All committee members are CFPC members in good standing and possess a sound understanding of the theory and practice of CPD and medical education.
