#### WONCA/Besrour prizes for emerging researchers

Dr. Sadok Besrour has generously sponsored \$10,000 (CAD) as a prize for the best research presentation, to be awarded every two years (alternating between the WONCA World Conference and the Besrour Forum). The inaugural presentation will be made at WONCA 2020 in Abu Dhabi this November.

### **Besrour working group updates**

#### **Medical Education and Training**

The first meeting of the advisory group took place in February. The group's task is to oversee the direction of and provide guidance for medical education and training activities within the Besrour Centre. The group is looking to develop educational resources that will be available for different jurisdictions. More details will follow

as they are developed. The group is collaborating with Syiah Kuala University in Banda Aceh, Indonesia, on capacity building as the university develops the family medicine postgraduate training program for September 2020. An abstract will be presented at WONCA 2020.
