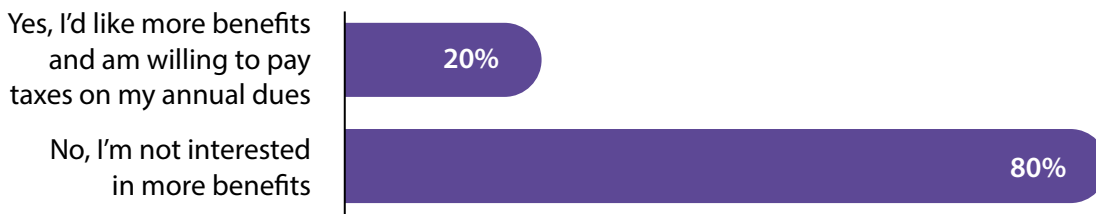




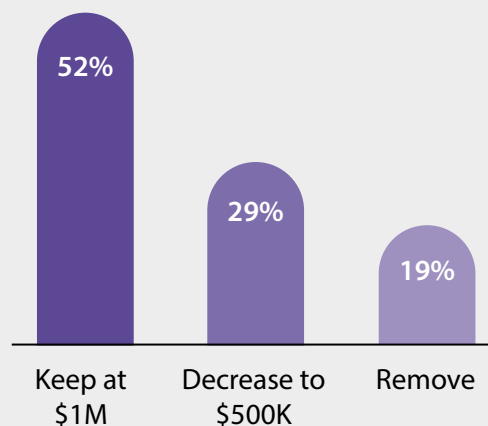
Family Doctor Perspectives on Cost-Cutting at the CFPC

The **ePanel** is a way for family doctors to provide their input on key issues to the CFPC, their professional home. CFPC members can **sign up** to be a part of the ePanel. After members voted against inflation-aligned fee stabilization, the CFPC is planning for reduced scope and services as revenues have fallen behind inflation by about 26 per cent since 2017 (the last time member fees were increased). The February 2026 ePanel focused on what to cut and what to keep at the CFPC (N=367).

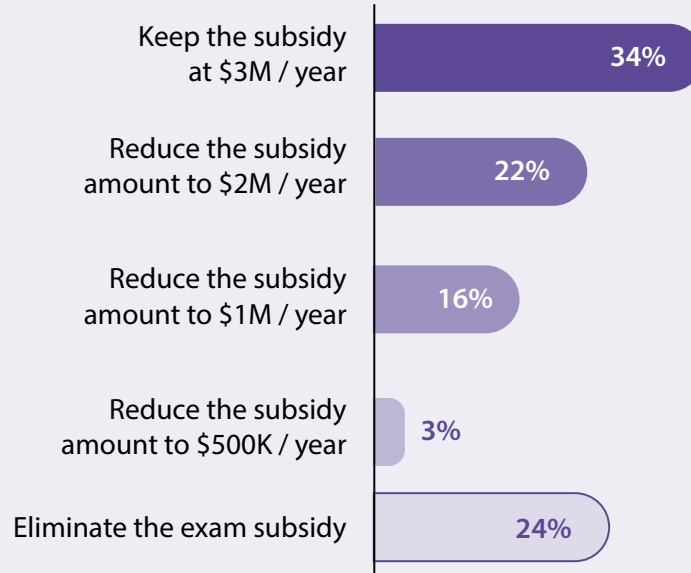

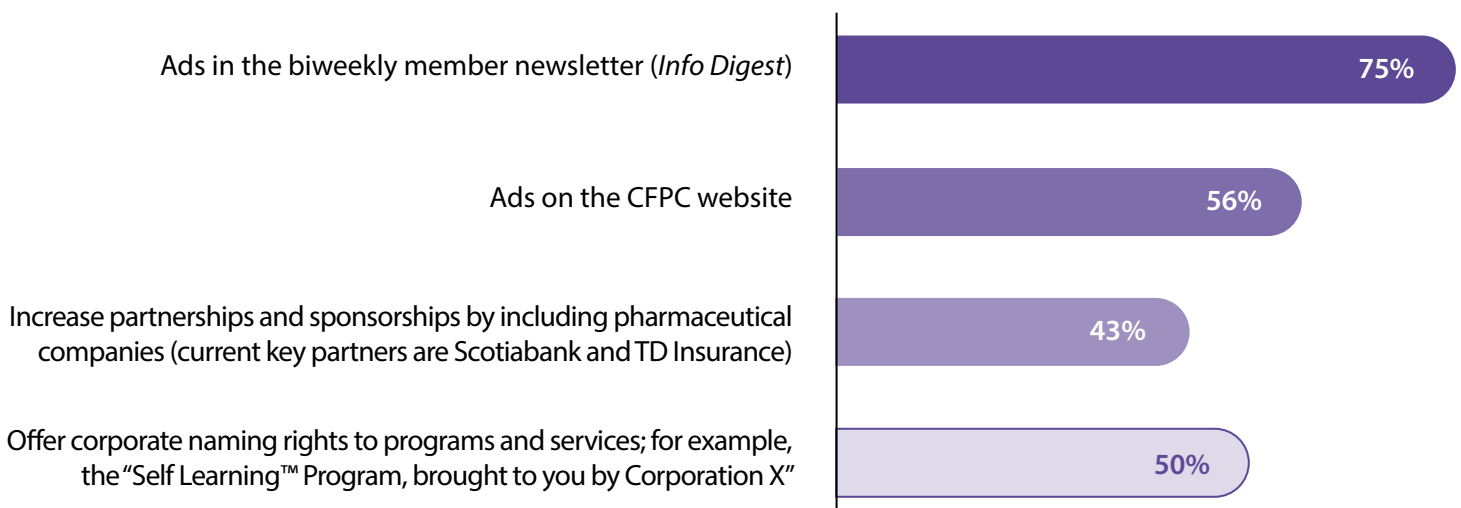
