The Policy Bite: shared principles of primary care. Dr. Ruth Wilson (Canada) and Amanda Howe (UK) write "... 'primary care' and 'primary health care' are often used loosely, and there is a need to define and characterise good primary care. Here are eight principles of primary care, recently endorsed by many primary care and family medicine organizations in North America, for consideration."

Atul Gawande's article in *The New Yorker*, <u>The Heroism of Incremental Care</u>, is an interesting follow-up to the discussions at the Forum about primary care— particularly the role the Besrour community could and should play in global primary care delivery.

"Primary care... is the medical profession that has the greatest over-all impact, including lower mortality and better health, not to mention lower medical costs."
