Besrour Strategic Plan:

Three meetings have recently been held to refine the Besrour Centre Strategic Plan (2016-2019), based upon the fruitful discussions at the 2015 Besrour Conference. We thank Cecil Canteenwalla and Clayton Dyck for their time and expertise. The document will soon be finalized and distributed to Besrour colleagues.

International Accreditation: We have been working with the College's Academic Family Medicine (AFM) Department with plans to work with the Pontificia Universidad Catolica de Chile to develop an accreditation process for their Department of Family Medicine

Current Collaborations:

Tunisia

The Besrour Centre and CFPC are working with a Canadian consultant to assist in the production of a manual to guide the development, evaluation and accreditation of CPD activities for all health professionals in Tunisia. A site visit is tentatively scheduled for end of May – beginning of June, 2016.

China

The CFPC has received an invitation by the Chinese Medical Doctor's Association (CMDA) to have one or two Mandarin-speaking experts present on primary care in the Canadian health care system at a conference in Beijing from April 15-19, 2016. The Besrour Centre and CFPC are currently identifying mandarin-speaking family medicine educators.

Brazil

A collaboration agreement with the Brazilian Society of Family and Community medicine, the CFPC and the University of Toronto Department of Family and Community Medicine has been approved by the CFPC Board. The Besrour Centre has been invited by our Brazilian colleagues to follow-up with a site-visit in spring 2016 to continue discussions surrounding potential areas of collaboration.
