# Working group updates

#### Faculty Development Working Group

Co-leads Lynda Redwood-Campbell and Clayton Dyck hosted a successful workshop at the conference in Rio, entitled (wait for it, it's a mouthful) **Global perspectives and local contexts: Moving forward in faculty development for your new family medicine program**. Through a combination of didactic and small group work, the session introduced an overview of faculty development concepts, provided examples/resources and lessons learned from the working group's recent activities, and provided attendees with an opportunity to share and develop their own faculty development strategies. The Working Group is heading into the home stretch with the focus group analysis conducted over the past year. Data analysis is nearly complete, with the anticipation of writing up the findings in the next 1–2 months.

# Narratives and FM Mapping Working Group

The Besrour Storybooth at WONCA Brazil was a resounding success, with 132 stories from 55 countries. The team, led by Christine Gibson, is now working on transcriptions, which will soon be analyzed for themes. Next steps will be further work on the Storybooth narratives: video production, working with WONCA and the Besrour Center to distribute, and presenting



at the World Summit on Social Accountability in Tunisia.

Also successful was the Pentagram Partners, led by Bob Woollard, and how important it is to hear the stories emerging from all partners when establishing health systems. The Brazilian colleagues participated, using their engagement model as an example.

The group hopes to soon publish the thematic analysis in *Canadian Family Physician* as a follow-up to the first piece about the process of gathering institutional narratives, and will be working on that this year as well.

## **Current collaborations**

#### **Chinese Medical Doctor's Association**

As part of the Besrour Centre's ongoing collaboration with China, a representative from the Chinese Medical Doctor's Association (CMDA) attended a Canadian residency training program accreditation visit as an observer. The visit was an important learning opportunity for the CMDA and an opportunity for the CFPC to engage in thoughtful discussion about its accreditation process. We were delighted to have had the opportunity to exchange knowledge with the CMDA about the Canadian accreditation process.

#### **Pudong delegation**

The Besrour Centre had the pleasure of hosting a group from the Pudong region of China. Participants were general practitioners working in community health centres or district hospital in Shanghai, many of whom also specialized in traditional Chinese medicine. The group was here as part of the University of Toronto's

International Program, which included their visit to the CFPC. The presentation was an overview of the Canadian health care system and the CFPC's education and accreditation.

#### Anhui delegation

The Besrour Centre recently welcomed 20 delegates from the Anhui Provincial Commission of Health and Family Planning in China. The purpose of their visit was to learn more about standards for accreditation of medical education programs, the development of quality health human resources, and improvement in the quality of residency programs and medical education.
