## Working group updates

**Faculty Development Working Group:** The group is presenting a competency-based training workshop at the WONCA Africa Regional Conference. For those unable to participate in the conference, the presentation will be available following the event.

Papers and Research Working Group: Three papers are near completion: "Contrasting current challenges from the Brazilian and Canadian national health systems," "Telemedicine in the driver's seat: a new role for primary care access in Brazil and Canada," and "Comparative analysis of the quality of primary care between Canada and Brazil from the patient perspective."

The manuscript for "A framework for ethical international academic partnership in family medicine" is now complete and will soon be published in *Canadian Family Physician*.



Advocacy, Community Engagement, and Ethics Working Group: The need for family practice champions to be linked to community engagement globally was flagged as far back as 2013, at the second Besrour conference. It has been raised at each subsequent Besrour Conference. Until now there has been limited capacity within the network to pursue this area of interest. Following a recent call-out, a group of Canadian and international partners held a teleconference to discuss this further. Co-leads have been identified and the next teleconference will be scheduled for late July or early August.
