UPDATE FROM THE CHAIR

Involvement in FMF 2016

Family Medicine Forum (FMF) 2016 will see an increase in emergency medicine (EM)-related content, which will include two half days; one will be geared to top of scope continuing professional development and the other to general family physicians. Session abstracts have been submitted and we are awaiting approval. We will provide updates as they become available!

Status of enhanced skills in the overall family medicine mission

The EM Committee has voiced its concerns regarding a recently published editorial by Dr Roger Ladouceur in the December 2015 edition of *Canadian Family Physician*, which implies that enhanced skills training and certification may reduce the number of family physicians offering comprehensive care, including house calls. The EM Program Committee feels this editorial ignores the fact that many family physicians with enhanced skills continue to deliver excellent, comprehensive care to a disproportionate number of people from vulnerable populations at unsociable hours.
