## **UPDATE FROM THE CHAIR**

The Respiratory Medicine Committee has been busy over the last while, with a number of initiatives completed or in development.

We are excited about our FMF respiratory topics, which include:

In June 2016, Dr Kaplan spoke at the Canadian Pharmacy Society about spirometry in Canada, opportunities in pharmacy practice, and opportunities to leverage the relationship between pharmacists and patients to ensure that patients are informed of the need to have spirometry to ensure accurate respiratory diagnosis. He and Dr Levitz will publish an article about this in their journal, and with the help of pharmacist educator Christine Petrasko, they have drafted a flyer to be given to all patients receiving an inhaler in a pharmacy advocating for spirometric testing.

Our newsletter continues to highlight recent newsworthy respiratory topics, as well as review respiratory literature to highlight things that all practicing clinicians should know about. Editorials are written by members of our Executive.

Dr Kaplan and Dr Li gave a presentation on COPD at the Dalhousie Refresher Day in the spring, which was well received.
