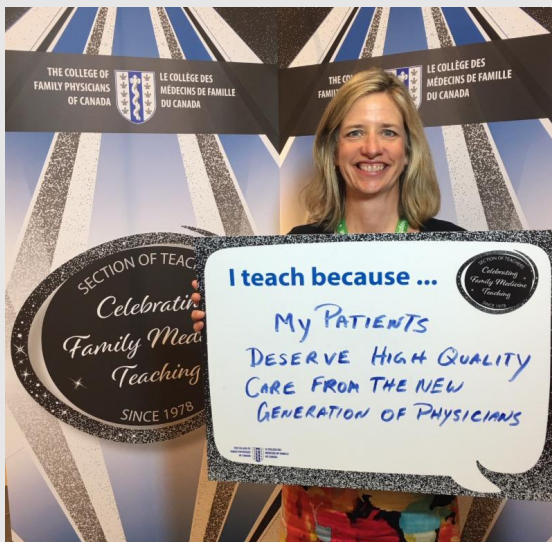


Join us in our ongoing celebration!

A homeroom for education activities

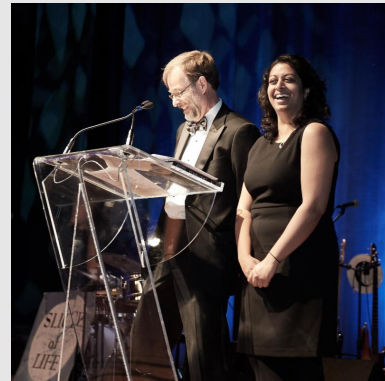
