


Spotlight on: Fundamental Teaching Activities

Intuitive in its language and practical in its approach, the *Fundamental Teaching Activities in Family Medicine: A Framework for Faculty Development* (the FTA Framework) describes what teachers do and helps them consider creative ways to expand and enhance their teaching activities.

An evaluation of the FTA Framework is currently being conducted by the University of Ottawa to understand its utility and uptake. The data gathered will help influence the College's future efforts to assess how to better support members as teachers and identify approaches to enhance faculty development.
