### What is the value of stories to family medicine research?

As these quotes assert, the art of storytelling is an important part of family medicine and the research that underpins it.

Stories and narrative can help bring to life the scientific evidence presented in a research paper. Stories can also offer family medicine researchers a valid source of information for qualitative studies, as well as inspiration, and perhaps a source of new research questions.

The <u>Stories in Family Medicine</u> database, developed by a forward thinking group of your research colleagues involved in the *CFPC History and Narrative in Family Medicine* project, is a valuable resource for family medicine researchers.

This database is an easily accessible, electronically searchable repository for the stories that have been gathered by the History and Narrative in Family Medicine committee. It contains over 200 stories, many submitted for the annual AMS - Mimi Divinsky Award for History and Narrative in Family Medicine.

Stories have been classified under various headings, including: birth, community, death and dying, family, health care delivery, history of family medicine, patients and physicians, etc., and can be searched by title, author, and subject.

We encourage you to visit the database, and read the many poignant and moving stories that record the day-to-day practice of family physicians in Canada. As you do so, we invite you to consider the relationship between the disciplines of storytelling, narrative and family medicine research, and the power, value and purpose of each.
